



# Take It Easy. A Beautiful Townscape Where History Lives On. Udatsu Historical District

In Japanese, when someone isn't getting ahead in life, they describe him as "not putting us on his road." That's not a good situation to be in. Fortunately, the neighborhood of Wakimachi in Mima has a historical district with streets all built, paved and road.

During the Edo period, the production of indigo promoted by the domain government grew to become one of Awa province's top industries. The town of Wakimachi, which benefited from water transportation on the Yoshino River, flourished as a central hub for indigo. The extravagant merchant houses in this town were built with stylish fire-prevention walls called udatsu. A historical neighborhood with streets decorated with family crests and other ornaments as well as ornate roof tiles remains in the town today, and it is a sight worth seeing. ## Millennia-Old Teramachi in Mima

There's a part of Mima called "Teramachi." Historical sites spanning more than a thousand years can be found here, including the prefecture's largest historical stone burial chamber, which was constructed in the Kofun period (3rd-6th centuries), the site of the prefecture's oldest temple, which dates to the early Nara period (8th century), and a historic temple that was opened some time during the Heian period (8th-12th centuries).
