



Recommended Viewing Spots in Mima

All throughout the year, Mima produces colorful sights and bountiful harvests. Our lives here are closely entwined with the natural environment.

- 1 Moss Phlox at Hirotana**
The Hana No Sato Shibazakura Festival takes place in the Hirotana area of Wakamachi in mid-April. The mountain scenery is colored by red, white and pink flowers like a carpet.

- 2 Weeping Cherry Blossoms at Kawai Pass**
From the 20 weeping cherry blossom trees can be found along the road leading to Kawai Pass and on the mountain slopes near Kawai Pass. The flowers that bloom at this mountain pass with an altitude of 700 m show across the scenery of the mountains, and the soft, pale pink blossoms are so lovely. These trees bloom about one week later than those on level ground.

- 3 Bush Clover at Saimyoji Temple**
Saimyoji Temple, which was founded in the Kamakura period, is also known as "Haji Temple", and the bush clover ("Haji") blossoms are in full bloom around the beginning of September each year. Some 200 bush clover plants near the main hall produce small red and white flowers that attract the temple priests. The bush clover blossoms have been designated a national important cultural property.

- 4 Teramachi Hanashobuen**
The Japanese Iris Festival takes place at Teramachi Park in early June. 3,000 Japanese iris plants bloom and various events are held.

- 5 Kanjo Falls**
This waterfall enjoys a distance of 33 m along the Kanjo Terakoya branch of the Anabuki River. Streams of water flow downwards via three tiers, creating a sound of water that can be heard from a distance. The water is said to be medicinal and powerful, and is used to spray everything getting soaked by it.

- 6 Sea of Clouds at Mt. Tsurugi**
The view from the summit, at an altitude of 1,055 m, is spectacular. The mountains of Mt. Tsurugi rise around the sea of clouds that spreads out before your eyes. This is a magnificent sight. The view that can only be seen at Mt. Tsurugi.

- 7 Tsurugikyo Gorge (Fall Leaves)**
This is the generic name for the river gorge that stretches from Kuchiyama, Anabukicho to Koyasato along the Anabuki River. The colorful leaves along the cliffs create a spectacular contrast with the turquoise river in the fall season, and the beauty will take your breath away.

- 17 Otaki-ji Temple**
Otaki Temple (714 Honzon, Wakamachi) is a national important cultural property.

- 18 Nishiteru-jinja Shrine**
This shrine is located on the prefectural border between Wakamachi, Mima and Shionocho, Takamatsu, Kagawa Prefecture. It is 546 m high. Nishiteru-jinja Shrine is located near the summit, and just below that is Otaki Temple (Shiozu, Benkei Nijo Hei / Fushiro No. 20). It is said to have been a god who was worshipped since ancient times.

- 19 Aoki Family Residence**
This residence was built in the early Edo period and designed with an intricate arrangement of the eaves and texture of wooden torii gates, which were constructed during the Edo period. It is a national important cultural property.

- 20 Miki Family Residence**
This house was built in the early Edo period and designed with an intricate arrangement of the eaves and texture of wooden torii gates, which were constructed during the Edo period. It is a national important cultural property.

- 21 Einstein Friendship Monument**
Mima has a well-known Einstein Friendship Monument. It was erected in 1954 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the birth of Albert Einstein. It is a symbol of friendship between Mima and the United States.

- 22 Tenjin-zakura**
This tree gets its name from its location, commonly known as Tenjin Forest. "Zakura" is referred to as Tenjin, and it has become a sacred tree. It has been designated a prefectural natural monument.

- 23 Yononaka-zakura**
This tree is said to be named because the state of its blossoms changes according to current economic conditions. It has been designated a prefectural natural monument.

- 24 Izanami-jinja Shrine**
This shrine is one of seven Shinto shrines in Mima District. The shrine is located in the vicinity of the production of honey. It is a national important cultural property.

- 25 Honraku-ji Temple**
This temple, said to have been founded by the monk En in March 1206 during the Heian period, is a national important cultural property. It is located in the vicinity of the production of honey.

- 26 Koito Pass**
When the roads of the Taira family were expanding to Mt. Tsurugi, a woman following her lover had to turn back at Koito Pass because of the steepness of the pass. There is a legend that the road decorated with padlocks that have been dedicated by honey producers.

- 8 Fureai Plaza**
At Anabuki Fureai Plaza, there is a "great stone table" - a table made in the shape of a giant stone. It is a symbol of friendship between Mima and the United States. It is a symbol of friendship between Mima and the United States.
